
Arioso Chamber Ensemble







The next Arioso concert program features Baroque music which has been used in film scores, including "Master and Commander", "Pride and Prejudice", "The English Patient", "Farinelli", "Shine", "Tous les matins du Monde", and "Boogie Nights"!

Baroque music captures every mood and has been used to great effect in many memorable screen moments, from the elegance of Henry Purcell's melodies heard in the Pride and Prejudice soundtrack, to the swaggering strumming of Boccherini's "La Musica Notturna" in Master and Commander. Who could forget the memorable final scene of "Shine" with Geoffrey Rush jumping on a trampoline to Vivaldi's "Nulla in mundo pax sincera"? The program also includes music by Marais, JS Bach, and Handel.

The concerts will take place at Eudlo Hall, Eudlo, on Saturday May 24th, and at St Paul's Anglican Church, East Brisbane, on Sunday May 25th. Both concerts start at 3.00pm, and last approximately 1 hour (no interval).
